The David Wojnarowicz Foundation Fellowship is a paid, semester-long position. Students work with The Foundation to preserve, advance and honor the life and legacy of David Wojnarowicz—his art, writing and fierce commitment to social justice.

We are looking for talented students in their junior or senior year working towards their Bachelor's degree in studio arts, art history, or graphic design at a New York City-based college or university. Fellows contribute their conceptual, graphic and motion design skills to ongoing projects such as managing the Foundation's social media networks. A stipend of \$2400 is paid for the semester.

David Wojnarowicz (1954–1992) was an artist, writer and activist in New York City's East Village from the late '70s to early '90s. Largely

self-taught, David was a charismatic and prolific creative whose work included photography, painting, sculpture, works on paper, performance, music and film. Whitney Museum of American Art curators (who held a retrospective of David's work in 2018) write: *Wojnarowicz refused a signature style, adopting a wide variety of techniques with an attitude of radical possibility. Distrustful of inherited structures—a feeling amplified by the resurgence of conservative politics—he varied his repertoire to better infiltrate the prevailing culture. Wojnarowicz saw the outsider as his true subject.*

The David Wojnarowicz Foundation launched on July 22, 2022 on the thirtieth anniversary of David's death of AIDS related illness.

- Experience with video production and Adobe Premiere preferred


Commit to:
